Fundraising campaigns

Governments and nonprofits cannot solve the world's most severe problems independently.

The Intensive Care of Khmelnytsky Children's Hospital

\$44,358 of **\$87,000** raised



We need to raise close to \$87,000 for this equipment to save children's lives. We will try to purchase it here in the USA and we already have ways to get it to the hospital from Poland directly delivered by car.

We are raising funds for an SUV that will allow us to distribute even more humanitarian aid to affected Ukrainians by war, assist the military, and evacuate the elderly or people with special needs, something that not everyone can do with an old vehicle like this.

Reuse mobile phones for charity



There are 28 electronic gadgets in the average US household, including smartphones, tablets, and laptops. With a continuously increasing supply of new devices, these items are being discarded or thrown into the trash more than ever before.

We offer to reuse your old electronic devices effectively to help people in Ukraine continue fighting and stay connected with family. This new fundraising goal balances its purpose and nonprofit mission to help people who don't have a budget purchase a new mobile phone.

At the moment, we are in need of at least **50 mobile phones**. The only requirement for an electronic device is to be functional. In addition, we will purchase a power bank for each donated device and ship directly to our volunteers in Ukraine.

The beautiful days for a kind cause!

APRIL 1, 2022

The last two days we spent together with our good friends we know for years, as well as with new ones we met during our daily working challenges.

Early morning by the gas station we met a guy from our district. Just recently we have found a rare specific medicine for his mother. Just want to highlight that he and his son keep defending Kyiv from the very first day of the war in Ukraine.



So we got our car ready with gas, goods, and food. There is a long trip ahead – both banks of Kyiv, including remote and out-of-the-way districts of the capital.

Summarily, we needed to fill the car in with humanitarian aid 4 times, stopping by to do that in 12 different shops and 8 pharmacies around the city.

APRIL 1, 2022



In the past, we have provided food, goods, and medicine for elderly people in Kyiv, but this story was shocking for our team.

On the way to get some paint for our local defending community, one random guy approached us and asked if we might have some food to share. He has a severe case of infantile cerebral paralysis.

He shared his story.

His mother and brother passed away, and he still can't get his social coverage money. He doesn't afford anything for himself to cover his basic needs.

Of course, we helped him and provided everything required such as food, water, and cigarettes. Afterward, he asked if we might have a pair of shoes since only expensive ones are at the stores and cost 23 USD. For him, it's very important because of his diagnosis and disability.

Well, what to say, we were shocked. So I got the first money out of my pocket (approx. 6.5 USD) and he started to cry, saying it was the happiest day of his life. So we covered all the clothing expenses for him, hugged each other, and wished him all the best.

When we were about to leave the place we met, he asked how he can help defend our country?

...And we realized there is one more hero standing in front of us and no matter what up to the last second of his life ready to fight for his own country, for his own Ukraine.

First responders are Ukrainian heroes!

APRIL 2, 2022

On our way to a hospital, to help survivors of the Chernihiv bombing, we found another store to get some fruits.

There we met two nurses who decided to buy a smaller pack of coffee, as they didn't have enough money for a bigger one... That was a conversation between two people who have been working without days off since the first day of the war, and who have been accepting and taking care of the wounded and sick victims from all over Ukraine. True heroes are those who help people. There wasn't a second to doubt that they need help. We got acquainted, and they turned out to be very positive. At first, they did not want our help – because that's what heroes are like. We covered their bill with everything they required and gave them a lift to work.



This story once again shows ordinary Ukrainians, who are ready to do anything for the sake of their country, even without support. Our main goal is to make their lives easier. Each of your donations is a great contribution to our victory, be it one dollar or 10 000 dollars.

After all, we all are defending the entire civilized world.

Russian terrorists bombed schools in Chernihiv

MARCH 3, 2022

The two schools (#18 and # 21) were used as bomb shelters for hundreds of kids and adults. That day, 47 people died.

The principal of one of the schools survived and is currently in Kyiv. I'm attaching her photo before and after the bombing. We are currently helping her and others who were evacuated to Kyiv. We're supplying them with medicine, certain products, and things they need.

They have lost everything – from their homes to affairs of their life. What remains are their lives, which they have dedicated to children, and which they will continue to dedicate to this case after our victory!



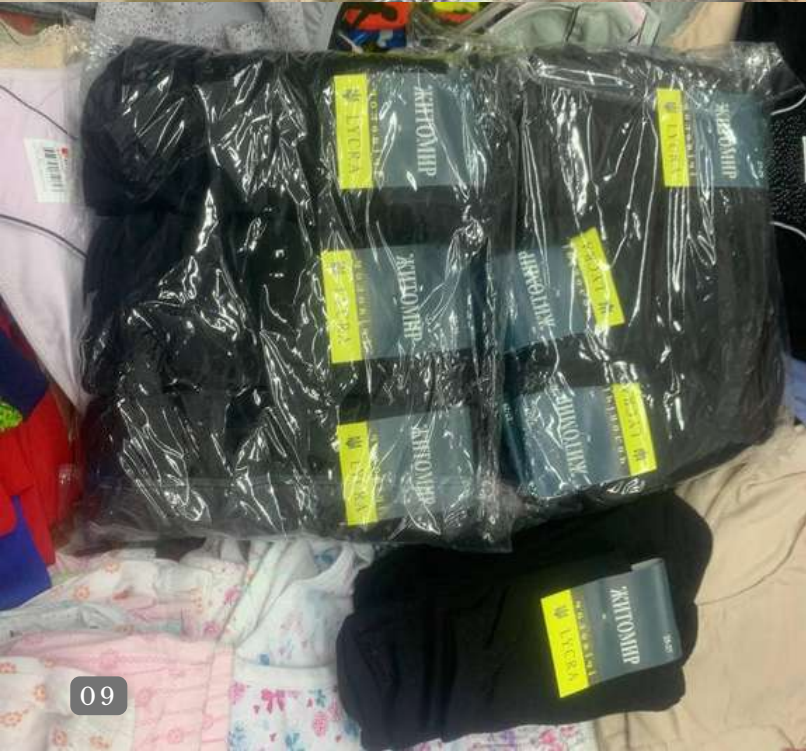
Military support

APRIL 3, 2022

We had a request for T-shirts and socks for the military and police, and we finally found a supplier. In total, we purchased and transferred everything necessary for 32 of our defenders. They also added to the package cigarettes and energy bars, which were also requested.

We're grateful to our partners, who helped us to make an amenity for our territorial defense and brought 48 Italian panettone pies, which can be enjoyed by 200 servicemen.

Traditionally, we have helped our kitchen of territorial defenses in Kyiv. There is a big problem with spices in Kyiv at this point, especially with tomato paste and citric acid. We have delivered groceries for Borscht, jams, and sweets.

It's been a sleepless night!

The train arrived earlier than we expected and arrived during the curfew. We had to jump in our cars at nighttime and drive around Kyiv in order to help volunteers. We went to the train station and tried to arrange to get to the premise to get there by car. Furthermore, we were refused to enter by car, so we had to carry everything in our hands, pack and load all night. The cargo came from our friend in the Lviv region. A total of 204 boxes that our volunteers will distribute to those in need in Kyiv.





Next day

APRIL 6, 2022

After filling the warehouse, we immediately delivered many food packages around Kyiv to provide food to low-income families and elderly people.

Second visit to the hospital

APRIL 6, 2022

It was our third meeting with the principal of the school that was bombed in Chernihiv.

Finally, getting admitted into her ward. We brought her the necessary clothing and the necessities to restore her vision. She smiled for the first time. This brought me to tears... The Ukrainians are incredible! Even in such a disaster, they can find the strength to smile.

Do you understand the spirit of these people? All of them are heroes. Our heroes. The inner strength of these people gives us goosebumps...

Trip around Kyiv

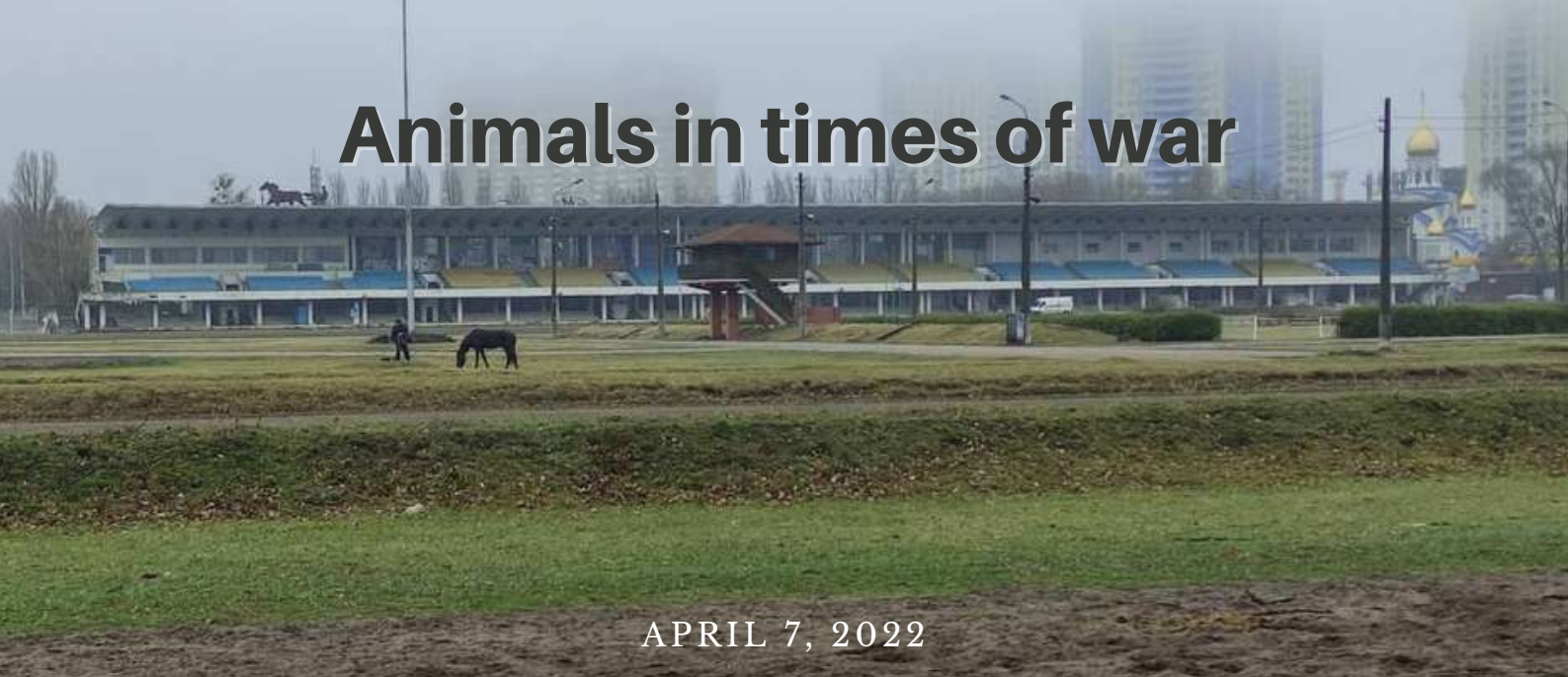
APRIL 7, 2022

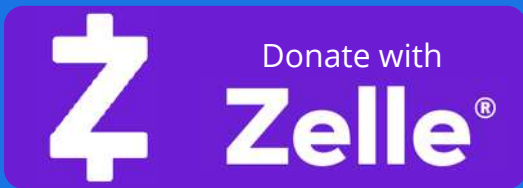
Glory to Ukraine!

After receiving the equipment, we shipped out 4 pumps to Children's hospital in Ukraine on April 12, 2022. One more shipment and we are done with this mission!



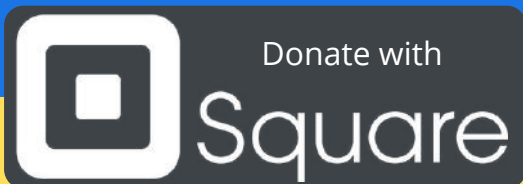
