My name is Kirill Basov and I am a local business owner who happened to be Ukrainian. I have created this page dedicated to aid efforts we have done so far in Ukraine. By collecting funds in USA and working with local groups directly on the ground in various parts and cities of Ukraine.

So finally after a week of getting things in order and money hitting the ground my copilot and friend since he was 8 years old - **Oles** was able to utilize the funds in distributing it where needed.

Oles has been running around doing a lot of work with only \$4 in his bank account. Luckily that changed due to our donors and help we received. Also due to his extensive connections and network of volunteers we are going to do amazing things.

Oles was able to utilize the funds in distributing where needed.

We were helping elderly people with food in our district, you can find photo down below.

Then we helped to release a mother with her daughter who was suffered as a result of bombing of the TV tower on March 1st. They were injured in the car near the tower. The mother needs new car and daughter needs new eyes... after two operations, there is hope for the restoration of vision. No photo and video due to the amoral nature.

Then ***we were able to help with delivery of food for military and elderly people with volunteer organizations.*** Now we are waiting on prices for

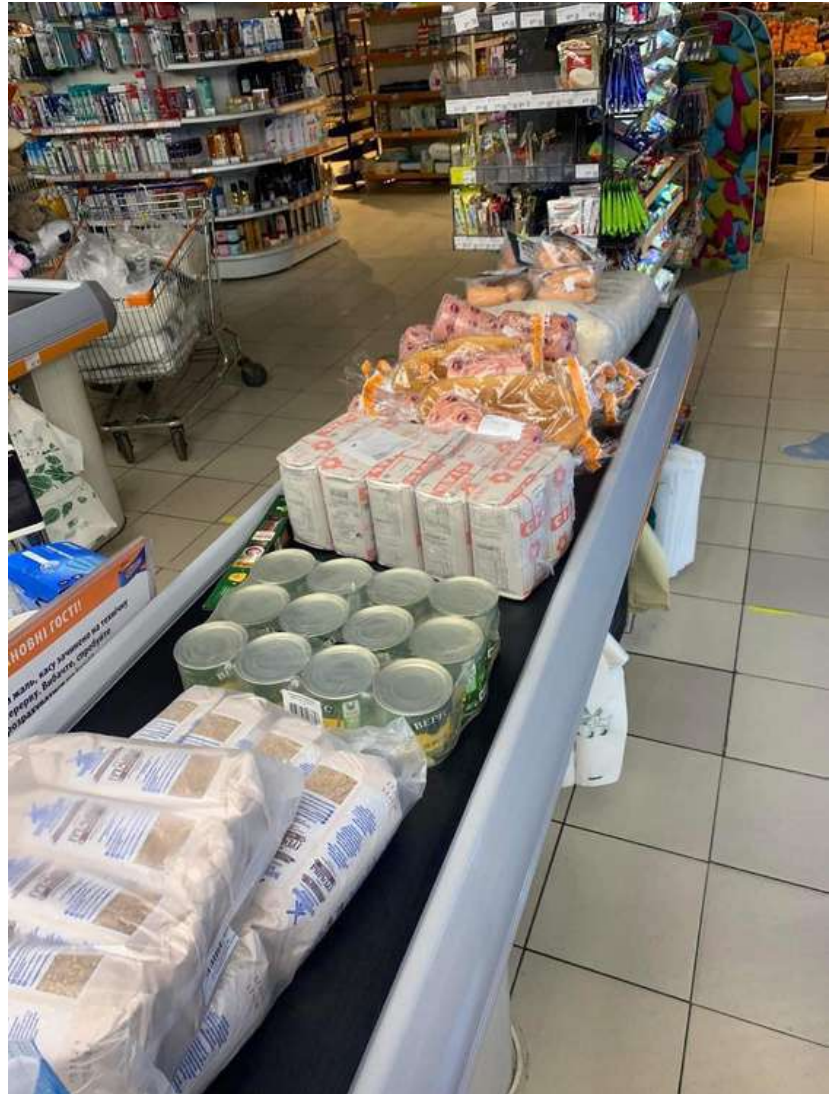
plates for body armor. I ordered 6 pack's.

was in disbelief that we actually made it!

We now have had two successful van deliveries to leveled city and will do more with your help!

A Big One - March 13th

From our volunteers, not perfect in English but perfect in results!



This wouldn't be possible without your support and donation!

*Today we started a new level
of our humanitarian work.*

We created **our own storage** for humanitarian goods in a friend's garage. At 2 A.M. our friends from Brody, Lvivskiy district, shipped 1st carriage of food, clothes and baby items to Kyiv. Overall it was 181 boxes.

We grouped our 9 Volunteers, 2 maxi vans and 2 cars to pick up our cargo. After the 7 hours we finished it.

It was a hard work but we know the goal, goal of our victory against Russian terror.



That's why we can do it with satisfaction and smiles on our faces.

In the evening we had time for “relaxing”, **we delivered a lot of bread for our military forces, bring food for 6 dogs and 6 cats**, shipped some clothes for families in a western part of Ukraine and helped one of our drivers with *baby goods and food for granny's*.



We will stand for Ukraine together till die!

Who could even imagine at the beginning of the russian terrorist operation that initiative of 2 friends will rise for a big deal and real help for dozens even hundreds of people.

This wouldn't be possible without your support and donation. I really want to say a big thank for UKI production and ***Kirill Basov*** personally for helping us.

For now our initiative group can involve up to 20 volunteers.

With our partners from other organizations up to 50-100 people.

We can use storages with a size of thousands of square meters.

We can take care of thousands of people.

But we really need your help with vehicle/petrol and our staff costs.



Staff costs during the war is not a salary or maintaining an office, it's costs for equipment, tactical clothes, body armors, helmets etc.

Now we are working 14-16 hours a day, 18 days in a row, without any military protection. And you can make our work a little easier and safer for us.

After the first round of donations we want to buy one SUV and one van for humanitarian needs and evacuation of people.

We need \$30,000 USD. If we collect more money, we want to buy some equipment and protection for our volunteers in the field.

Now we stand in defense of the whole civilized world and fighting against occupants in Europe, it's 2022 and unfortunately this is not a nightmare, it's our real life.

Our Monday - March 14th



Report from volunteers:

"As usual today **we helped elder people** with food and medicines, sent one car with goods to Vasilkiv, Kyivskiy district, helped our military forces with 150 pairs of socks and 36 Kg of pasta.

Also we visited military stores but unfortunately we bought just a pair of gloves. In the end of the day we bought frozen food for our volunteers.

Finally all caught up on all the reports through today. It took me forever to type all of these up and post. But it is important to show everyone, especially our donors the work that's being done and how much can be done in partnerships of good people.

Inflation hits the art world

\$79.7M sale of Magritte painting breaks record

One of René Magritte's famed "Empire of Light" canvases sold March 2 for \$94 million, pounds with fees, or about \$787 million, almost three times the auction high price for a work by the Belgian surrealist artist. Certain to raise at least \$60 million, courtesy of a guaranteed minimum price financed by Sotheby's, the 1961 painting was sought by three bidders, all represented by Sotheby's specialists on telephone in London.

The painting, "Temple des humains," which juxtaposes a nocturnal landscape street with a serene daylight sky, is one of the most celebrated and enigmatic images in 20th-century art. Magritte painted no fewer than 17 versions of the day-and-night subject starting in 1938.

Sotheby's variant, one of the latest and largest, had been owned for Aveo-Maria Gillian Crowet, the daughter of Magritte's friend, patron and chess opponent Pierre Crowet. It had remained in the same family collection ever since.

"Over the years, there have been numerous versions that have been sold, and they have performed extremely well," said Melanie Chere, a co-founder of

Neil Diamond sells entire catalog to Universal Music

Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, Paul Simon, Neil Young, Willie Nile. All have sold their music catalogs over the past year and a half for huge sums, part of a broad transfusion of the ownership of a generation's music: from artists to corporations and investors. But is there any big name left?

One giant was hiding in plain sight: Neil Diamond, 81, the singer and songwriter of ubiquitous hits like "Sweet Caroline," "Song Sung Blue" and "Duck and Cover." The Universal Music Group announced Feb. 28 that it had acquired the star's writing/songwriting catalog, as well as the rights to his recordings. Financial terms of the deal were not disclosed.

Diamond's work as a songwriter is particularly

Local entertainment entrepreneur lends a helping hand to his native Ukraine

Ukraine-born UKG Productions founder Kiril Basov, whose coming-to-America success story was featured in Notables a year ago, has started a private fund to deliver donations to Ukraine. UKG Productions will match the first \$10,000 donated.

Basov now lives in Lake Worth and is a graduate of the Dreyfus School of the Arts. He's working with people on the ground in Ukraine who volunteer to support regular civilians, refugees, and the military.

So far, the endeavor is just beginning, but Basov plans to organize fundraising events in collaboration with local businesses and entertainment venues. UKG Productions plans to donate all profits from future events and services the company provides.

One benefactor stated, "We are a group of Ukrainian volunteers, located in Kyiv, giving volunteer assistance:

humanitarian help, evacuation, supplies for the military, and support for abandoned pets. Due to the war millions more need medical items and food. Things that were familiar to us a few days ago now resemble a horror movie."

According to Basov, funds have already helped. "We have already established a kindergarten for 20 in a bomb shelter and helped evacuate a family from Kyiv to Kiyevobitskiy. We're also supporting 15 elderly people; and are helping to shelter dogs and cats in the combat zone."

Yesterday ***we were contacted by a local fellow Ukrainian.*** She has immigrated with her mom to US about 5 years ago. She was happy to start a new life in America and currently working on finishing her degree in becoming a dentist. Leaving behind *in Ukraine another doctor in the family - her brother.* Who is currently on the ground ***in Khmelnytskyi Children's Hospital, serving as an anesthesiologist in intensive care unit.***

Here is their story:

The Intensive Care of Khmelnytskyi Children Hospital wasn't expecting this tremendous amount of kids!

As the war in Ukraine began, millions of Ukrainians have fled the war. More than 3.6 millions of them have fled the country, but **7 millions of people are fleeing inside Ukraine**. Khmelnytskyi is one of the cities in Ukraine to welcome those severely affected by war. The Intensive Care of Khmelnytskyi Children Hospital wasn't expecting this tremendous amount of kids, and now is overwhelmed due to the lack of medical equipment for those in critical condition. Because of the war, buying the needed equipment became virtually impossible. *Firstly, because there are no warehouses available to order it; and secondly, because there are no funds.* At this point our goal is to collect the funds and ship the medical equipment directly from USA, in order to give a chance for life for children the life of which depends on this equipment."

We need to raise close to \$60.000 for this equipment to save children's lives. We will try to purchase it here in the USA and already have ways to get it to the hospital from Poland directly delivered by car.

March 23d Report update



We **helped people in hospital** with food and goods delivery, **helped elder woman with drug delivery**. Helped our military forces with **night vision system and tactical glasses**. Also **we do evacuation of 3 people from Brovary.**"



Update on humanitarian work March 24 & 25



After visiting the Alexandria Hospital for medicine in the morning, we traditionally met with Svitlana, who became our friend. ***She was injured because of the explosion on the Kyiv*** TV tower with her daughter (photo attached).

This is a person who in a terrible situation always remained optimistic and refused any help, except for basic things like coffee, cigarettes or water. She keeps inspiring us every day.

During the conversation, we were told that women from the Chernihiv region who had been evacuated after the bombing had been admitted to the ophthalmology department. ***They arrived to the hospital in warm shoes and warm jackets, absolutely without any private things.***

We contacted them and ***the only thing they asked for were shoes that we bought and delivered right away.*** People were sincerely happy and thanked for the sneakers for 12\$ which they so desperately needed. Think about it - just one lunch or 2 cups of coffee that you send us donuts can help people who have been left homeless, without money and miraculously survived.

During this day we also took Svetlana and her daughter home after the 3rd operation and helped them with evacuation backpacks.

Today ***we provided women from the Chernihiv region with all things and clothes.***



While we traveled between different places, we also ***helped a person from the street who could not get to the church to be in hiding place.*** This was an ordinary woman from Alexandria who lost her job in Kyiv and could not get to her hometown.

After that we were going home, but we were called by acquaintances and told that the woman could not keep her balance after the stroke and injured her chin. It was evening and all the pharmacies were closed, and they didn't even have a bandage and a band-aid to stop the bleeding. Arriving at our warehouse, we took everything we needed and a little more in 20 minutes **did another good deed.**



Gratitude for UKI Production and personally to **Kirill Basov** for their support and to all our donors. Without your support, we would not be able to cover all logistics needs and maintain our warehouse. **Together we are a force, everything will be Ukraine.**

Starting a fund raiser for the new car and method of delivery for our volunteer team.

We will ***need to raise*** anywhere from ***\$12.000- \$20.000*** for an ok car.
And this is why:

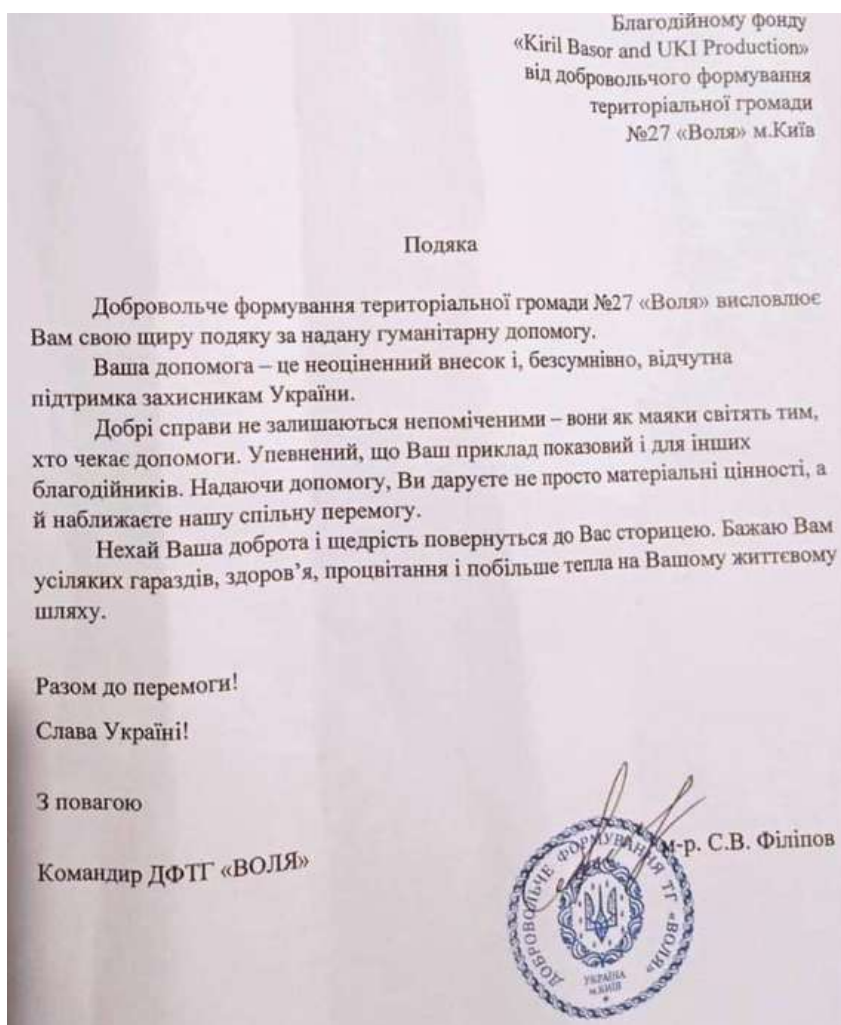


After a month-ride on our beloved Volvo C30, which often is driven more than 200 km a day in Kiev and it's region. Considering the number of checkpoints and the conditions in which we had to stay, it had to be repaired frequently.



I will remind that this is a compartment car with 2 doors, but it is always completely filled up and even sitting there is difficult. Let me remind you that we are raising funds for an SUV that will help to deliver even more things for people who really need them , help the military and evacuate the elderly or people with special needs, because not all of us can do that with such a transport.

We have been helping the defense forces of Kiev with bunch of different humanitarian help so they finally asked our volunteers how are they functioning, getting all the necessities, and where are they getting the funds from.



They answered it's our friend Kirill Basov and his company UKi Productions. So they felt compelled to write us a letter. Here is translation:

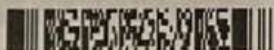
